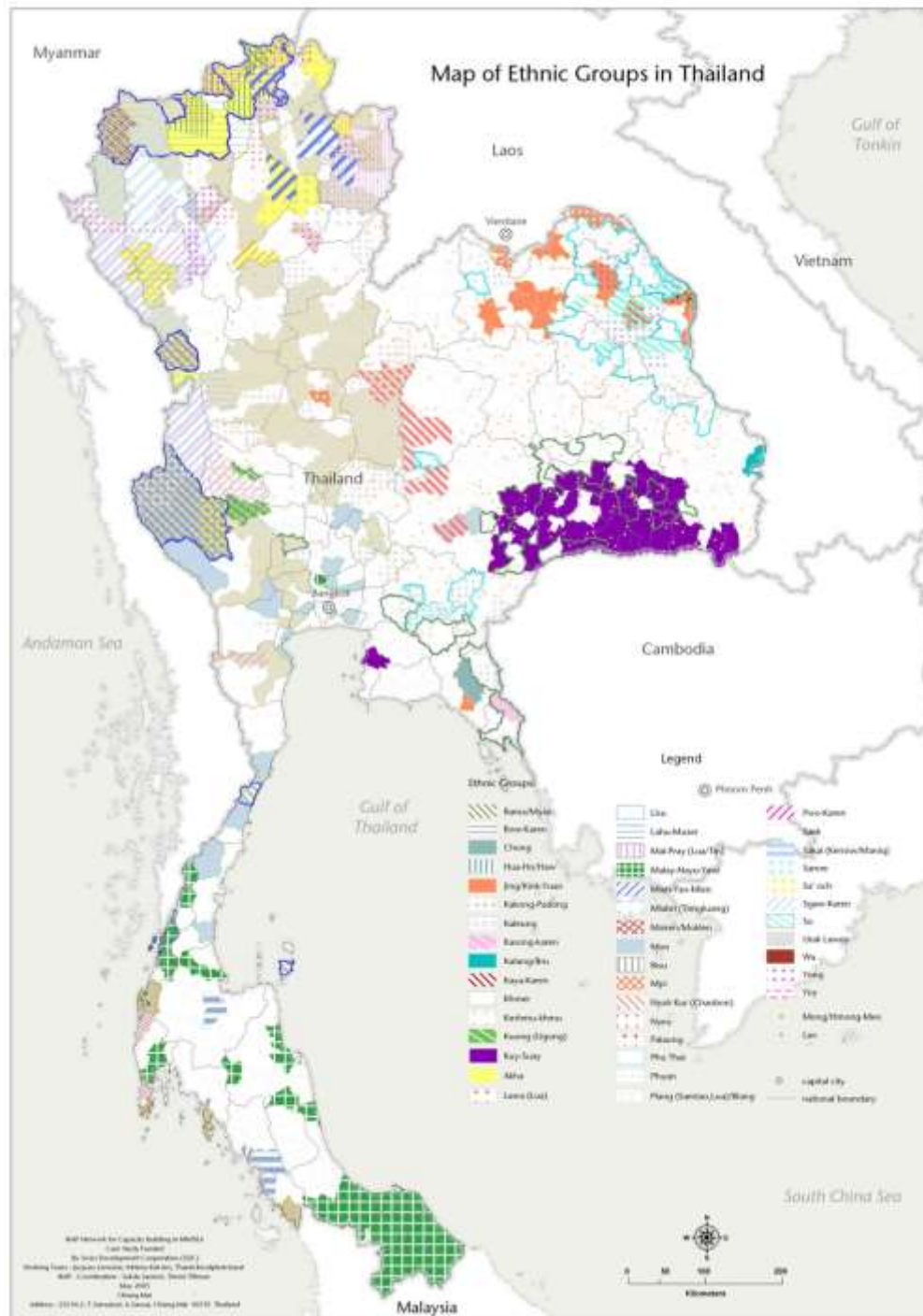

# Background:

## Objectives:

- To discuss and exchange views and experiences on issues and concerns of indigenous peoples on the impacts of climate change and proposed solutions of the governments in tackling such impacts, which potentially have negative impacts to them.
- To present the key recommendations that came out from the workshop of indigenous peoples for the consideration and action of the Thai governments
- To find common ways and means in coping with the impacts of climate change through a genuine partnership and with full and effective participation of indigenous communities at all levels.



- Dialogue was held on 19-20 November 2015 in Chiang Mai, Thailand
- 46 Participants attended: IPOs, IP leaders, government agencies and CSOs.
- Government agencies attended:
  - Climate Change Coordination and Management Division (CCMC)
  - Community Forest Management Bureau, Department of Forestry
  - Forest and Plant Conservation Research Office, Department of National Parks, Wildlife and Plant Conservation
  - Forest fire control and protection unit, Protected areas regional office 16
  - Protected areas regional office 16
  - Inthanon National park





# Key outcomes

1. Increased knowledge and understanding of IP leaders on the policies, measures, programmes of the Thai government relating to climate change and global negotiations
  - National Master Plan on Climate Change (2013 – 2050)
  - REDD +
  - Wildfire and haze problem management policy



# Key outcomes

2. Increased knowledge and understanding among involved government agencies on impacts, concerns of IPs on issues relating to climate change mitigation and adaptation measures at different level including key messages of Ips to COP21



### 3. Future collaboration

- Development of national adaptation plan
- REDD+ (Safeguards, REL, etc.)
- Wildfire and haze management
