A day dedicated to Sand and Dust Storms (SDS) will be organized at UNCCD COP 14 in the Rio Conventions Pavilion. The SDS Day will serve as a platform to inspire and facilitate information exchange among various stakeholders and partners involved in SDS related issues from policy and decision making, implementation, science, experts to field practitioners and local communities. Outcome of discussions will ultimately input to COP deliberations on SDS and other related fora.

In the SDS Day event, SDS related initiatives/programmes/products/projects will be launched including the UN Coalition for Combating Sand and Dust storms, a compendium for sand and dust storms and a global SDS source base map. This includes on-going efforts and future actions in addressing SDS impact. The SDS Day will provides an opportunity for knowledge sharing and capacity development of interested stakeholders.

The SDS Day can facilitate cooperation and collaboration in SDS management in support of the implementation of major global decisions and policies including the UNCCD COP decisions related to SDS including decision 31/COP.13 (2017), and the provisions of UNGA resolutions on combating SDS, namely resolutions 70/195 (2015), 71/219 (2016), 72/225 (2017) and 73/237 (2018), and UNEA resolutions 2/21 (2016) and 4/10 (2019).
