More than 2 billion hectares of the world's deforested and degraded lands offer opportunities for restoration – an area larger than South America. This is a vast opportunity to reduce poverty, improve food security, reduce climate change, and conserve biodiversity. Why aren't we doing more restoration?

The Bonn Challenge – a global effort to restore 150 million hectares of lost forests and degraded lands by 2020 – was launched in September 2011 as a contribution to achieving the REDD+ goal and CBD Target 15 as well as the UN framework on food security.
